

Here are some solutions members are implementing to find a reasonable compromise and protect the people we serve.

Permissions to leave & return

- Define "essential errands"
- Loosen self-quarantine requirements
- Structured campus outings
- Requirements to wear PPE

Permit entry to more service providers

- Medical professionals
- Construction
- Flooring
- Pet Care

Monitor and loosen visitor restrictions

- Designate areas of campus / scheduled visits
- Define exceptional circumstances
- Monitor state and federal restrictions

Resuming moves into campus

- Structured move process with infection control measures
- Define "essential moves"
- Specific protocol of service professionals
